
MaineHousing Welcomes New Commissioners **Paul Shepherd**

New loan reservations coming into the program have slowed in recent weeks, which is typical for the late fall season, and is a likely reflection of the rise in mortgage interest rates, which have doubled since the beginning of the year and are now averaging just above 7% in Maine. On the positive side for homebuyers is the slow decrease in home prices, and there are reports of some gain in the inventory of homes for sale which has been a huge




