This MaineHousing Notice # 2026-HARP-001, is being issued to establish the HARP Program Guidance and HARP forms changes for PY2026.

1. CAAs are now required to spend 60% of their allocation on Warm, Safe, and Dry projects, and 40% of their HARP allocation on emergency projects.

HARP Guidance Section B9.2.a.

- (2) CAA funding will be allocated as follows:
 - a. 2026 HARP Funding Allocation
 - i. Sixty percent (60%) of the total Group 1 funding will be allocated for Home Repair and Older Adult Home repair components.
 - ii. Forty percent (40%) of the total Group 1 funding will be allocation for Emergency Home Repair, Emergency Manufactured Home Repair, and Accessibility.
- 2. Signatures and their corresponding dates should match.

HARP Guidance Section B9.C.5.

- (5) Signatures and their dates must match the form execution. If a document is signed or initialed with a physical (wet) signature, the signer must handwrite the corresponding date next to the signature. If a document is signed electronically, the corresponding initials and dates corresponding must also be electronic.
- 3. Beginning in PY2026, MaineHousing will implement a process for distributing biannual HARP Performance Reports to agencies.

HARP Guidance Section B10.B.5.

MaineHousing will distribute biannual HARP Performance Reports to sub-grantees. MaineHousing will review each agency's overall performance using several key indicators, including:

- a. Production Number of projects in progress and completed.
- b. Project Type Utilization across all eligible project categories (Home Repair, Elderly Home Repair, Accessibility, Emergency Home Repair, and Emergency Manufactured Home Repair).
- c. Funding Progress toward full utilization of allocated funds.
- d. Work Quality Accuracy and completeness of files, including each agency's file review error rate.
- 4. HARP Applicants must sign a Permission to Share Information Form within their application.

HARP Guidance Section B9.C.5.

HARP recipients must now give consent to both the CAA and MaineHousing to share their eligibility records across Energy and Housing Programs. A Permission to Share information section has been added to the HARP Application.
